## Are you a PEP?

## If you are,

- an individual who is entrusted with prominent public functions either domestically or by a
- in an international organization and includes a head of a State or a Government,
- a politician,
- a senior government officer,
- a judicial officer.
- a military officer,
- a senior executive of a State-Owned Corporation/Government or Autonomous body (does not include middle ranking or junior ranking individuals) or
- close family members and associates of above

You will be categorized as a Politically Exposed Person (PEP) when conducting Customer Due Diligence by Financial Institutions (FI) and Designated Non-Finance Businesses and Professions (DNFBP).

You are required to inform your status as a PEP, if you are coming under above definition when conducting a transaction with FIs and DNFBPs.

## Financial Institutions (FI)

Eq: ♦ Licensed Banks

- Licensed Finance Companies
- Stock Brokering Companies
- ◆ Money or Value Transfer Service **Providers**
- ♦ Insurance Companies
- Restricted Dealers

## **Designated Non-Finance Businesses** and Professions (DNFBPs)

Eg: ♦ Casinos

- ◆ Real Estate Agents
- Gem and Jewellery Dealers
- Accountants, Lawyers, Notaries and Other Independent Legal **Professionals**
- ◆ Trust and Company Service Providers

FI and DNFBPs are required to implement appropriate internal policies, procedures and controls to determine, if the Customer or the Beneficial Owner is a PEP, when they conduct transactions for their customers.

This is a requirement under the Financial Transactions Reporting Act, No. 06 of 2006, Financial Institutions (Customer Due Diligence) Rules, No. 01 of 2016 and Designated Non- Finance Business (Customer Due Diligence) Rules.

The collection of such information from customers is a globally accepted practice. Hence, the support and co-operation of customers of all FIs and DNFBPs are solicitated.
